The Liturgy for the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

*"Be doers of the word and not hearers only . . ."
Today's readings challenge us to live in Christ-like holiness.*

The Ten Commandments that God gave to Moses on Mount Sinai contained statutes and ordinances that the people of God were required to observe. These were not ten choices to obey or disregard as they chose. If God's people obeyed God's commands, everyone would recognize God's wisdom.

James asks us to welcome God's word as a perfect gift from above. We must have the humility to know that God's wisdom surpasses our own limited intelligence. God's word is life-giving; it has the power to save us. But simply hearing God's word is not enough; we must allow it to take root in our lives so that we can act on what we hear.

Jesus echoes the words of the prophet Isaiah 29:13, "This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me" (Mk 7:6). Jesus summons us to ignore those who obscure the will of God with their human traditions, and instead listen to his voice. "Hear me, all of you, and understand"

For Reflection: Do I merely hear God's word, or do I truly listen and then act on it?

The Catholic Bible Seminar - Fall 2009 Session Weekend of September 11, 12 and 13, 2009

The fall 2009 Session of the Catholic Bible is coming up, and once again the Speaker/Presenter will be Father Jim Nisbet of Spreckles, California. This will be the 22nd Session of the Seminar since starting in 1996. The seminar will be held at St. Mary's RC Parish on Joyce Street, Vancouver, probably the most centrally located parish in the Archdiocese.

TOPIC: "The Second Letter of Paul to the THESSALONIANS", and on completion, immediately followed by "The Letter of Paul to the PHILIPPIANS" and if timely, "The Letter of Paul to the COLOSSIANS."

DATES: Friday, Saturday and Sunday, September 11, 12 and 13, 2009

LOCATION: St Mary's RC Parish Hall, beneath the church at 5251 Joyce Street, Vancouver, BC. (Side entrance on Euclid Street)

TIMES: Friday evening, 7.00 PM to 9.00 PM - [Doors open for registration at 6.30 PM]
Saturday and Sunday mornings, 9.00 AM to 5.30 PM

Holy Mass in the church on the Saturday morning at 9.00 AM, immediately followed by a continental breakfast in the Hall. The first session on the Saturday starts after this at 10.20 AM. On the Sunday the Seminar closes with Holy Mass (the Sunday Liturgy), starting at about 4.45 PM.
